Emergency Procedures

1. Minor injuries may be initially evaluated by coach or parent
 - If further assistance is needed, locate medical personnel, Event Director or an Event Official
2. In an emergency situation for an athlete:
 - A coach, parent, event official, volunteer or medical personnel will contact a covering Event Physician or Event Director, who will evaluate and call 911 if necessary
 - The Event Physician and Event Director will communicate with each other via two-way radio of any emergency situations
3. In an emergency situation involving a coach, spectator, or volunteer:
 - 911 should be called immediately before contacting Event Physician or Event Director
 - The Event Physician and Event Director should still be promptly notified of any emergency situation, and will communicate with each other promptly as well
4. In any emergency situation involving more than one person, medical personnel should place an initial emphasis on rapid evaluation and triage, and activation of the Emergency Response System if necessary
5. Any emergency situation involving loss of consciousness, loss of any of the ABCs (Airway, Breathing, Circulation), or neuromuscular compromise should prompt early activation of the Emergency Response System by calling 911 and also involve rapid evaluation by the event physician

Activating Emergency Response System

Call 9-1-1

Provide Information

- Name, address, telephone number of the caller
- Nature of emergency (medical or non-medical*)
- Number of athletes
- Condition of athlete(s)
- First aid treatment initiated by the first responder
- Other information requested by the dispatcher

* If non-medical issue arises, refer to the specified checklist of the venue's emergency action plan

Emergency Equipment

All medical and event staff should know where to retrieve emergency medical equipment

AED - Medical Tent

AED - EMS Rig

First Aid Supplies - Medical Tent and with physicians on site per event

Spine board – Medical tent or EMS rig

Ice - Medical Tent

Medical Bag – Medical tent
